Nursing Home and Hogarth Riverview Manor.


"The residents of Bethammi Nursing Home really enjoy the music program with the Lakehead University music students," said Nadia Thatcher, director of the facility.

Elizabeth Arding and Harry Servais hold hands as they join their neighbours and university students in a round of Christmas carols.


der Bay facilities will be evaluated.

Any lessons learned will be documented and included in a tool kit of music resources.

The tool kit will be shared nationally with other long-term care

homes, Lakehead said.

The project is part of a five-year research program led by Lakehead University's Centre for Education and Research on Aging and Health, which aims to improve quality of
